

Suggested Native Trees for Street Planting

Common Name	Latin Name	Notes
<i>Acer campestre</i>	Hedge Maple	Small. Tough and compact.
<i>Amelanchier canadensis</i>	Serviceberry	Small. May be trained to single trunk. Small, fairly dry, fruit.
<i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>	Hornbeam	Medium – large.
<i>Celtis occidentalis</i>	Hackberry	Small – medium.
<i>Cercis canadensis</i>	Redbud	Small. Showy spring flowers. Many cvs.
<i>Cladastris kentuckea</i>	Yellowwood	Medium - Large. Showy summer flowers.
<i>Cotinus obovatus</i>	Smoketree	Small-medium. Showy pink flowers in summer.
<i>Crataegus viridis</i> 'Winter King'	Winter King Hawthorn	Small-medium. Attractive fruit fairly dry, but may be an issue.
<i>Gymnocladus dioica</i>	Kentucky Coffee Tree	Large. Showy flowers. Male trees don't produce fruit.
<i>Magnolia virginiana</i>	Sweetbay	Small-medium. White flowers. Evergreen varieties available.
<i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>	Tupelo	Medium-large. Male trees only. Scarlet autumn color.
<i>Oxydendrum arboreum</i>	Sourwood	Small-medium. May need initial irrigation. Showy flowers.
<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>	Bur Oak	Medium-large. Acorns may be an issue.
<i>Sassafras albidum</i>	Sassafras	Small-medium. Yellow autumn color.
<i>Taxodium ascendens</i>	Pond Cypress	Small. Upright. Casts very light shade.
<i>Taxodium distichum</i>	Bald Cypress	Large. Does not form knees in dry areas. Casts light shade.
<i>Tilia cordata</i> (not native)	Littleleaf Linden	Small.
<i>Viburnum nudum</i>	Poosumhaw	Small. Showy flowers. Fruit may be an issue.
