C. Councilman Case – Recreation

D. Deputy Town Supervisor McLaughlin – Library (Supervisor DiPaola reported for him)

The grant money has been a successful program with good upgrades and repairs for the Library. There is a small structural issue that was discovered and that will also be covered by this grant. New lights have been put up on the property. The sign will be up shortly.

New Business – Supervisor DiPaola

- A. Todd Cross spoke on behalf of the ½ Marathon proposed for November 2016, which will be organized by the Pelham Civics. It is proposed for November 26, 2016, which coincides with Small Business Saturday. They anticipate 200 or more runners, and proceeds will be donated to the Pelham Civics. The Daronco Town House and Gazebo will be the start and finish line staging area. Portable bathrooms will be set up in the parking lot.
- B. First teen concert will be at the Gazebo this weekend with Mark Sidgwick. It should be a nicely attended event.
- C. A 9/11 Committee was established. Maggie Klein was a driving force behind this. A tasteful ceremony is being planned for this year's 15th anniversary with the 2 villages, the families that were affected, and the fire and police departments.

- D. Constables: The Memorial Day Parade went well. 500 people went through the metal detector in the last month. A new constable will start next week.
- E. The Eagle Scout Project is awaiting approval from the Boy Scouts of America to do some work to Veterans Park to maintain and beautify the park.
