

A MESSAGE OF THANKSGIVING & UPDATE FROM THE PELHAM TOWN BOARD

Dear Pelham Neighbors:

It's hard to believe that one year ago, we were entering one of the darkest winters of our lifetime due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Since that time, things certainly got worse before they got better, with another one-half million Americans losing their lives. And we continue to deal with concerns for our community's health and well-being on a daily basis.

Despite all that we have been through this past 1.5 years+, however, there is much for us to give thanks for. Deaths and hospitalizations are way down. The widespread availability of the vaccine, including now for children aged 5-11, has given us hope that we are coming ever-closer to COVID-19 becoming endemic, like the flu. Currently, while there are 15 active cases in the Village of Pelham, and 37 in Pelham Manor, at least 86.8% of Pelham residents have at least one dose of the vaccine, and 75% have 2 doses, with those numbers improving every day. We are back to going to plays, movies, concerts and sporting events, and most everything in-person again. *And this Thanksgiving, most of us can be together again with family, friends and neighbors.* For all of this, we are grateful and wish everyone a wonderful Thanksgiving!

Town Election Results

- Supervisor Daniel McLaughlin was uncontested and returns to lead the Town Board for another two-year term. This will be Supervisor McLaughlin's 12th year as a member of the Pelham Town Board. He has served as Councilman since 2009. As Supervisor, Dan McLaughlin has played a crucial role in helping the Town navigate the extraordinary challenges relating to COVID-19. This included daily (and now bi-weekly) calls with the County Executive's office, drafting an Emergency Safety plan, and working with Town Board and Village leaders to maintain the health and safety of the Pelham community.
- **Rafaella ("Rae") Szymanski** returns to the Town Board for another four-year term. Rae has been a Town Councilwoman since 2001. Rae retired as the COO of the VNA of Hudson Valley after 20 years in that position. Rae was named the first female Deputy Supervisor in January 2020, and will continue in that role for the remainder of her term. As Deputy Supervisor, Rae plays a key role in serving as the liaison for employee relations with the Town Board. She ensures required trainings take place, such as the annual sexual harassment trainings. She also serves as liaison for emergency services in the Town of Pelham.
- Kara McLoughlin was elected to the open seat being vacated by outgoing Town Board member Timothy Case. The Town Board welcomes its newest member, who will be sworn in in January for the start of her four-year term. Next month we will highlight the tremendous contributions made to the Town of Pelham by outgoing Councilman Tim Case. In January, we will tell you more about newly elected Councilwoman Kara McLoughlin.
