



Town of Pelham Board Update **Summer 2022**

Dear Pelham Friends and Neighbors:

We hope you have had a restful (if not hot!) summer thus far, and are enjoying these last few weeks of summer before the busy fall arrives. One of our most popular events in Town this summer has been the Monday Summer Concerts at the Gazebo. We've had excellent music and great food (thanks to our local food trucks), and hope that you can make it out for the last few concerts of the year on August 29th, September 12th, and September 19th.

Recreation

Summer 2022

The Pelham Recreation Department had a great summer, with full day camps and tiny tots reaching their highest-ever capacity, and lots of happy campers.

- Tiny Tots: at Prospect, there were 80 enrolled campers; at Colonial, there were 90 enrolled campers and at Siwanoy, there were 70 enrolled campers. (There was no camp at Hutch this summer due to the continued construction in that area.)
- Big Tots: had 120 campers enrolled.
- Day Camp: had 90 campers enrolled.

Some of the activities for the day campers this summer included trips to Yankees and Mets games, Rye Playland, the Bronx Zoo, Splash Down Beach in Fishkill, Quassy Amusement Park in Middlebury, CT., several trips to The Picture House, ninja warrior and giant water slides on the fields, and a carnival the last week of camp.

The Recreation Department also ran various sports clinics such as running club/track and field, tennis, volleyball, and soccer with Malcolm.

Fall Youth and Adult Recreation Programs

Fall youth recreation programs are now available for sign up on the [recreation website](#). These include cheerleading, chess, dance, dance with me story time, flag and tackle football, karate, ninja warrior, rugby, running club, soccer with Malcolm, theatre arts, and tiny tiger.

There are also adult running club and tennis at Glover Field, and pickleball at Julianne's Playgroun. Sign ups are also on the recreation website.
